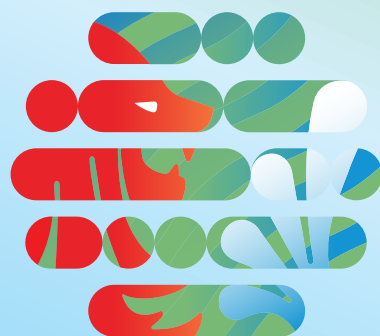

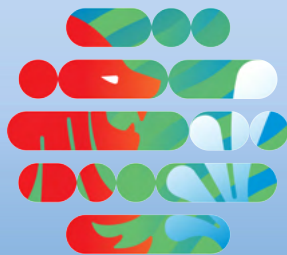

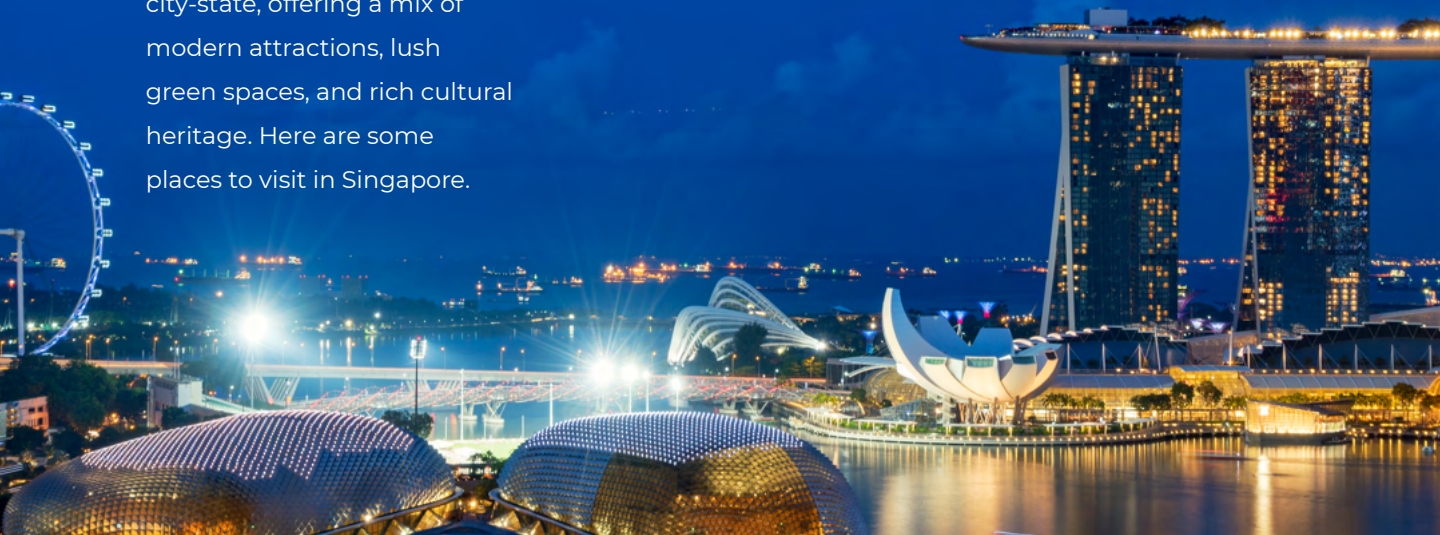

Chinatown

Kampong Gelam

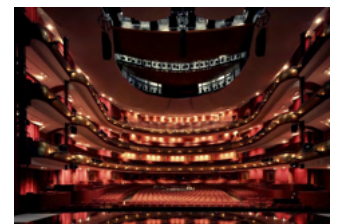
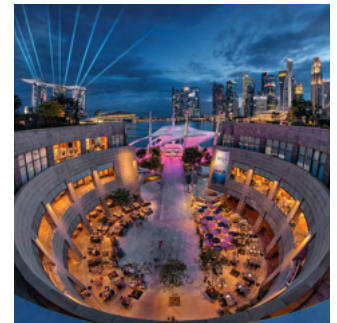

Merlion Park



Commemorate your visit to The Lion City with a photo of Merlion Park's most iconic resident – the majestic Merlion, which stands in front of Fullerton Hotel and overlooks Marina Bay. With a head of a lion and a body of a fish, this beloved symbol has inspired myriad works of art and poetry. The Merlion's fish-like body symbolises Singapore's origins as a fishing village, known as Temasek—a name which comes from same root as the word tasek (lake in Malay). The statue's head represents the city's original name of Singapura (lion city in Sanskrit).

Esplanade – Theatres on the Bay



Whether you're in the mood for dance, music or drama, the show must go on at Singapore's premier arts centre, where world-class performances abound. Renowned for its striking exterior reminiscent of the city's beloved tropical fruit, the durian, Esplanade - Theatres on the Bay is a truly iconic landmark. Come marvel at its distinctive design made up of two rounded glass domes fitted with over 7,000 triangular aluminium sunshades!

Marina Bay Sands



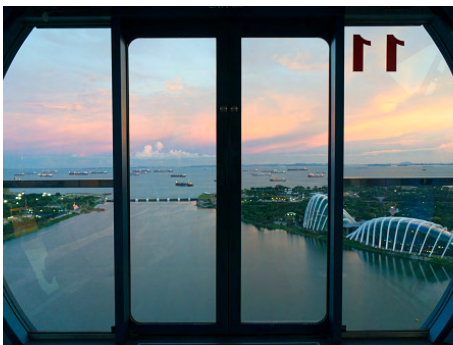
This iconic luxury hotel features the world's largest infinity swimming pool with stunning views of the city. It also includes high-end shopping and various dining options. The Sands SkyPark Observation Deck offers panoramic views of Singapore.

The ArtScience Museum is home to a fascinating array of exhibitions that explore the intersections of art, culture and technology. This lotus-inspired museum is dubbed the welcoming hand of Singapore on the Marina Bay waterfront. Don't forget to catch Spectra – A Light & Water Show, a free nightly outdoor 15-minute extravaganza happening on selected days of the week.

Singapore Flyer

Standing 165 meters above ground, Asia's largest observation wheel offers stunning views of Marina Bay and our city's breathtaking skyline. A 30-minute ride in one of the Singapore Flyer's glass capsules offers 360-degree views. Spot iconic and historical sights from Marina Bay to the Singapore River, and from Raffles Place to Merlion Park.

With clear skies, one can spot landmarks up to 45km away, up to Changi Airport, Sentosa Island and parts of Malaysia and Indonesia.



Gardens by the Bay

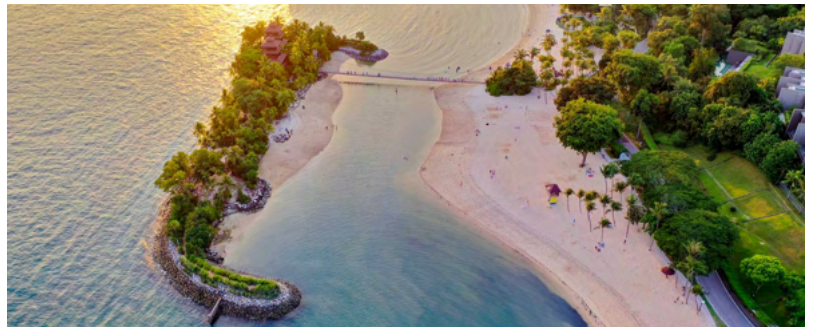
From iconic architecture to natural marvels, Gardens by The Bay boasts spectacular sights and sounds for the entire family. The beauty of nature beckons visitors to the Flower Dome in Bay South Gardens. Covering 1.28 hectares, this verdant space is the larger of three cooled conservatories and broke the Guinness World Record as the World's Largest Glass Greenhouse in 2015. It is home to plants and flowers from five continents, from thousand-year-old olive trees to magnolias and orchids.



Spectacular Supertrees - these iconic structures are home to vertical gardens, soar up to 50 metres above the ground and come to life in a glorious spectacle of light and sound after dusk. The Supertrees also collect rainwater, generate solar power and act as venting ducts for the park's conservatories. Don't miss out on the Garden Rhapsody, a dazzling light and sound show happening daily.

Sentosa Island

Sentosa is Singapore's premier resort destination, known for its beautiful beaches and a host of attractions. Thrills aplenty await the entire family at Sentosa, from iconic restaurants like Coastes to the unforgettable rides at Universal Studios Singapore.



Other highlights include the S.E.A. Aquarium, one of the largest in the world, which showcases marine life from around the world. Explore adventures into nature by cruising around on a Segway or ziplining above the treeline on Mega Adventure Park, Sentosa's beaches and natural beauty is a sight to behold.

Other attractions at Sentosa include the Resorts World Sentosa, Sensoryscape, The Palawan @ Sentosa, Singapore Cable Car, iFly Singapore and Skypark Sentosa.

Mandai Wildlife Reserve

ESSENTIAL INFORMATION

Weather & Timezone

Enjoy summer all year-round with Singapore's tropical climate (25-33°C). Dress in light, airy clothing and bring along an umbrella in case of occasional rainfall. Singapore Standard Time is situated in GMT +8 time zone, so be sure to calibrate your watches accordingly.



Safe Drinking Water

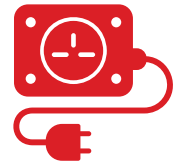
Tap water in Singapore surpasses World Health Organization standards. You may drink water straight from the source or easily purchase them from stores. It is important to stay hydrated, especially in Singapore's climate, so carrying a reusable water bottle and refilling it with tap water or purchasing bottled water is a good practice.



Power Plug

The standard electrical current used in Singapore is 220-240 volts AC (50 cycles) and you may use power plugs with three square prongs here.

It is recommended to check the compatibility of your devices with the voltage and plug types in Singapore before your trip. Some devices, such as laptops, smartphones, and camera chargers, are often compatible with a wide range of voltages and may only require a plug adapter.



Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi connection will be available at the venues of the World Aquatics Masters Championships for all participants.

In Singapore, visitors may access free Wi-Fi at any Wireless@SGx hotspot with their foreign mobile numbers by downloading the Wireless@SGx App. Charges may apply.



Accessibility Options

All MRTs (trains) and public buses are wheelchair accessible and open strollers are allowed. Please approach the train staff or bus captains if you need assistance.



Ways to Pay

There are multiple ways to pay for your purchase and public transport rides such as contactless bank cards, mobile wallets, stored value cards, concession cards or cash.

Smoking

Smoking is prohibited in buildings, retail food establishments, transport nodes, public service vehicles, and sports facilities. Designated smoking areas are marked with notices or signs.

To participate in the World Aquatics Masters Championships – Singapore 2025, participants will need to complete the online registration <https://registration.worldaquatics.com> following the dates indicated in the table above.

Registration and payment for all events are required for all participants by 26 June 2025. Registrations and event entries will not be considered without completed payment. Registrations submitted after 26 June 2025 will not be considered.

Participants are to note that registration may close before the deadline if participation quotas are met.

Registration Process



1. Register at <https://registration.worldaquatics.com>



2. Click 'Create Account'.

Select 'Masters Athlete', 'Masters Coach' or 'Masters Accompanying Person'. Participants of the previous World Aquatics Masters Championships can use existing log-in details. All athletes must be registered before coaches.



3. Enter your personal information, accreditation photo and any relevant documentation.



4. Select 'World Aquatics Masters Championships Singapore 2025' in the Event Tab.



5. Select the aquatic sports events in which you intend to compete.



6. Pay the Participation Fee online. Once payment has been made, a message will be sent to your e-mail address informing you of the payment result.




7. Once **participation fee** has been paid, please click on the '**Sport Entries**' tab to select your intended entries, click **submit** and proceed for payment.



8. Registrations submitted by **Masters Athletes and Coaches** will be **reviewed and approved** only after receiving **confirmation from the respective National Federation**. Therefore, please ensure you are **correctly affiliated with your club's National Federation** before registering for the events.

A section of the spectator stands will be allocated to accredited persons to view the competition (Athlete, Coach and Accompanying Person). Children under the age of seven are not permitted to access competition venues unless accompanied by Masters participants with valid accreditation.

Registration for Team, Relay and Synchronised Events (Swimming, Diving, Artistic Swimming, Water Polo)

For team sports, only individuals registered as a Coach can manage Team Entries. If no Coach is registered for a club, a registered athlete from that club may act as Captain by selecting the 'I am the Captain' option. Both the Coach and the athlete acting as Captain can only select athletes who are registered with the same club.

Once the Coach or Captain completes the registration process, the Team Entries tab will become available. Here, the Coach or Captain can select competitors for each event to form the team. After making the selections, they will proceed to pay the team entry fee.

ELIGIBILITY RULES



Swimming

Minimum Age Limit: 25 years old

Age Determining Date: The actual age of the competitor will be determined as of 31 December 2025.

Age Groups for Individual Events: 25-29, 30-34, 35-39, 40-44, 45-49, 50-54, 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, 70-74, 75-79, 80-84, 85-89, 90-94. (five-year age groups, as high as necessary)

Age Groups for Relay Events (Based on the total age of team members in whole years): 100-119, 120-159, 160-199, 200-239, 240-279, 280-319, 320-359. (in forty-year increments, as high as necessary)

Individual Events:

Freestyle: 50m, 100m, 200m, 400m, 800m

Backstroke: 50m, 100m, 200m

Breaststroke: 50m, 100m, 200m

Butterfly: 50m, 100m, 200m

Individual Medley: 200m, 400m

Relays:

- 4x50m Freestyle

- 4x50m Medley

- 4x50m Mixed Freestyle

- 4x50m Mixed Medley

All events will be swum as timed finals.

Entry Restrictions:

- Participants must be a member of a Federation Club
- A swimmer may:
 - ▶ enter a maximum of five (5) individual events, but not more than two (2) individual events per day.
 - ▶ enter the open water swim in addition to the five (5) swimming events.
 - ▶ enter a time for an individual event that does not exceed the qualifying time for that event.
- Entries without times will not be accepted.
- No entries & times changes are allowed after the Final Entries Dateline (Date to be confirmed).
- For safety reasons, Swimming competition is limited to 6,000 swimmers OR if a competition day exceeds 10 hours.
- Entries will close when the limit of 6,000 swimmers/10 hours per competition day is reached even before the official closing day of the platform. Information of the number of swimmers/number of hours per competition day will be published on the Singapore 2025 Championship website.

Qualifying Standards: The times should be obtained during a sanctioned meet. World Aquatics suggests that the times should be obtained within two years of the Championships.

Please note that the actual time of the event swum which has exceeded the qualifying standards, will not be shown on the result sheets but instead will be noted on the result sheets as N.T. (No Time). More details on the qualifying standards will be provided in future editions of the Info Bulletin.

If a participant has registered with qualifying times for the swimming competitions of the World Aquatics Masters Championships and significantly underperforms by recording much slower times in their first event, World Aquatics and the Organizing Committee may disqualify the participant from all other swimming events of the World Aquatics Masters Championships - Singapore 2025.



Open Water Swimming

Minimum Age Limit: 25 years old

Age Determining Date: The actual age of the competitor will be determined as of 31 December 2025.

Age Groups: 25-29, 30-34, 35-39, 40-44, 45-49, 50-54, 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, 70-74, 75-79, 80-84, 85-89, 90-94. (five-year age groups, as high as necessary)

Entry Information: Masters competitors entering Open Water Swimming must be familiar with the requirements needed to participate in an Open Water Swimming event and they must have made appropriate preparations for the event.

For safety reasons, competing in Open Water Swimming is limited to 1,000 swimmers per day. Entries will close when the limit of 1,000 participants per day (men and women included) is reached, by age groups assigned for the respective days.

Length Of Course: Three kilometres (two laps of 1.5 km)

Time Limits: Swimmers who are unable to cover the 3km distance within 90 minutes are recommended to refrain from participating. Swimmers who remain on the course beyond this duration might be directed to exit the water, and their time may not be recorded.

If a competitor fails to complete the first 1.5km of the first lap in 45 minutes, he/she will not be allowed to proceed to the second lap and shall be disqualified.

Swimmers will be organised by age groups and will start in the water in their respective waves, which will be determined after registration closes. It is compulsory for all open water swimmers to wear swim caps, provided by the Organising Committee. Transponders will be used during the competition.



Diving

Minimum Age Limit: 25 years old

Age Determining Date: The actual age of the competitor will be determined as of 31 December 2025.

Age Groups / Events:

- Individual Springboard (1 metre & 3 metre) and Platform – Men & Women: 25-29, 30-34, 35-39, 40-44, 45-49, 50-54, 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, 70-74, 75-79, 80+ (five-year age groups, as high as necessary)
- Synchronised Diving (3 metre springboard & Platform) – Men, Women & Mixed Team: 50-99, 100+ (age determined by adding the ages of the two divers)

Entry Information:

- Individual entries shall only be accepted from persons representing clubs. No diver or team may be designated as representing a country or Federation.
- A participant can represent only one club in each sport.
- A diver can compete in only one team per Synchronised Diving event.
- In synchronised diving events two divers from different clubs within the same Federation are permitted to compete as a synchronised diving team in the 3m springboard and the platform synchronised diving competitions.
- Masters Competitors must be aware of the need of being well prepared and medically fit before entering a Masters competition. Officials may remove competitors from an event where the competitors' safety is a concern.
- Maximum number of entries for Diving is 300 competitors in total (both men and women included). Entries will close once the limit of 300 divers is reached.



Water Polo

Minimum Age Limit: 30 years old

Age Determining Date: The actual age of the competitor will be determined as of 31 December 2025.

Age Groups:

- 30-34, 35-39, 40-44, 45-49, 50-54, 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, 70-74, 75-79, 80-84, 85-89, 90-94. (in five-year increments, as high as necessary)
- Age groups shall apply for men and women teams. The age of the youngest member of the team determines the age group of the team.
- There are no restrictions on the ages of players other than the youngest player on the team.

Entry Information:

- Masters Competitors must be aware of the need of being well prepared and medically fit before entering into Master's Competitions. They shall assume full responsibility for the risks included in competing in such competitions. In consideration of their entry, they must agree to waive and release World Aquatics, the Organising National Federation and the Organising Committee from any kind of liability for accidents, which may cause death, injury or property loss. Entry Forms containing a warning of the risks, an Accident Waiver and Release of Liability must be signed by each Masters competitor.
- A club can enter only one team per age group.
- Maximum number of entries - 80 teams.
- The maximum number in each age group is 20 teams.
- During the preliminary rounds when there are 17 or more teams entered on the same age group, some or all teams may play more than one game per day.

Entry Procedure:

- To be eligible for the competition, each water polo player must complete an individual registration and pay the individual registration fee and the team must pay the registration fee for a team.
- A nominated coach, manager/team representative must submit the fully completed Team Sheet for entry into the competition. Changes on the Team Sheet are not allowed after the nominated coach, manager/team leader has reconfirmed the entries at the Technical Meeting.

Composition of Teams:

Each team shall consist of seven players, one of who shall be the goalkeeper and who shall wear the goalkeepers cap, and not more than eight reserves may be used as substitutes, listed on the game roster, which must be submitted to the official's table for each game, not less than 45 minutes before each game commences. All players listed on the game roster will be eligible to play in the game. After the games has commenced, a team playing with less than seven players shall not be required to have a goalkeeper.

- A team may enter up to 15 players on their team entry form to participate in any game of this tournament (i.e. seven players and up to eight reserves). It is not compulsory to name a substitute goalkeeper. A goalkeeper who has been replaced by a substitute may, if the player returns to the game, play in any position.
- Women players may be members of a men's team.
- A player may only represent one team in the competition and all players must be registered with the same club.
- If less than three teams are registered in an age group, they will be asked to compete in the next youngest age group or alternatively combined to the next older Age Group, while maintaining a separate ranking. The concerned teams shall be consulted for approval and given the possibility to cancel their participation with return of paid fees.
- An Age Group with three teams entered can be combined with the next younger or older Age Group if these groups do not have more than four teams entered and with the approval of all concerned teams. The playing schedule and the plan for rankings shall be decided by the World Aquatics Masters Commission.
- For Women's tournament the composition of groups is depending on the number of entries in each Age Group. The World Aquatics Masters Commission can combine the groups including teams of more than two Age Groups. The approval by the entered teams shall be asked. A playing schedule and the plan for rankings for each Age Group shall be decided by the World Aquatics Masters Commission.



Artistic Swimming

Minimum Age Limit: 25 years old

Age Determining Date: The actual age of the competitor will be determined as of 31 December 2025.

Age Groups:

- **Solo (Men & Women):** 25-29, 30-39, 40-49, 50-59, 60-69, 70-79, 80 and over
- **Duet:** 25-29, 30-39, 40-49, 50-59, 60-69, 70-79, 80 and over with the age group determined by the average age of the competitors.
- **Mixed Duet:** 25-29, 30-39, 40-49, 50-59, 60-69, 70-79, 80 and over with the age group determined by the average age of the competitors.
- **Team:** 25-34, 35-49, 50-64, 65 and over with the age group determined by the average age of the competitors.
- **Free Combination:** 25-39, 40-64, 65 and over with the age group determined by the average age of the competitors.

Events:

- Masters Artistic Swimming includes various events such as Women Solo, Men Solo, Duet, Mixed Duet, Team, and Free Combination, with medals awarded for each event.
- Overall Masters program features Technical Routines, Free Routines, and Free Combination, with each event standing independently.

Entry Restrictions:

- All duet, team and free combination competitors must represent the same club.
- Each club may enter one free combination in each age group. A competitor may take part in only one Solo, Duet, Team and one Free Combination.

Team Members:

- Each team shall consist of a minimum of four and a maximum of eight members. A half-point penalty will be deducted from the total team score for each member less than the eight.
- Free combination shall consist of a minimum of four members and a maximum of ten members.

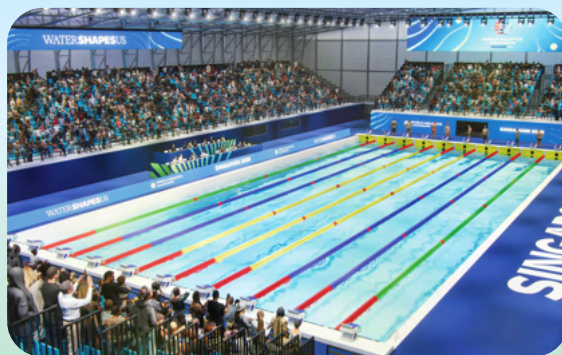


COMPETITION VENUES

WORLD AQUATICS CHAMPIONSHIPS ARENA

OUR TAMPINES HUB

Our Tampines Hub will serve as the location for Artistic Swimming competition during the World Aquatics Masters Championships. The facility will also host Water Polo training sessions during the World Aquatics Championships - Singapore 2025. The venue is designed to host both sporting events and entertainment activities, making it a versatile hub for various large-scale events in Singapore.

GENERAL ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To enter Singapore, travellers must meet the following immigration and customs requirements:



Passport Validity

Have minimum 6-month passport validity.



Visa

- All participants of World Aquatics Masters Championships – Singapore 2025 are to check if an Entry Visa into Singapore is required.
- Short term travellers holding a passport or travel document from a visa-required country/region must apply for a Visa.
- Visa-required travellers can use the **Visa-Free Transit facility** for stay of less than 96 hours in Singapore, if eligible.
- Please refer to attach Singapore Entry Visa process flow chart and access [entry requirements](#) for more information.



Visa applications may be submitted:

- Through an authorised visa agent appointed by the Singapore Overseas Missions; or
- At the nearest **Singapore Overseas Mission**.
- All foreign visitors arriving in Singapore will be notified digitally of their Visit Pass (e-Pass) through email. There will not be any endorsement on your passport. The e-Pass notification will indicate the period of stay granted and last day of stay allowed.

Security and Immigration Process on Arrival

- Ensure that you do not bring prohibited items into Singapore.
- Familiarise yourself with the Checkpoint's Entry clearance procedures, including whether you are eligible for automated clearance.
- Short-Term travellers should have sufficient cash and proof of onward travel (tickets, visas), and ensure that you do not stay beyond your visit pass validity.
- You may retrieve your e-pass after arrival using the **e-pass Enquiry Portal**. Note that Singapore's Immigration & Checkpoints Authority does not accept submission of visa application over the immigration counters.



Customs Declaration

Make a Customs declaration and tax payment using the Customs@SG web application before arrival if you are entering Singapore with goods exceeding your Goods and Service Tax (GST) import relief and/or Duty-free concession.

SG Arrival Card (SGAC)

All travellers are required to submit the SG Arrival Card within three (3) days (including the day of arrival) before arriving in Singapore. Submission of SG Arrival Card is free and can be done via the [SGAC e-Service](#)



Public Health Requirements

To avoid tests and quarantine, travellers must fulfil the public health requirements below. Travellers who cannot meet the public health requirements and refuse any test(s) and/or quarantine may be turned away from Singapore.



Measures against mpox

- Travellers are strongly advised to adhere to the mpox health advisory, especially if they are travelling to and from affected countries. Travellers who have fever, rash and/or symptoms compatible with mpox will be referred for medical assessment.
- All travellers are required to report mpox-related symptoms (e.g. fever or rash) and travel history through the SG Arrival Card. Travellers who have fever, rash and/or symptoms compatible with mpox will be assessed by doctors at the borders, and subsequently referred to hospitals for further assessment and testing, if necessary.



Measures against Yellow Fever

- Produce an International Certificate of Vaccination for Yellow Fever, if you have visited any country at risk of Yellow Fever transmission in the six (6) days prior to arrival in Singapore.
- Travellers must serve quarantine for six (6) days from date of departure from countries with risk of yellow fever transmission if they cannot meet the requirement. Quarantine also applies to those who are ineligible to receive the vaccination e.g., children aged one year and below and individuals with contraindications, and travellers whose yellow fever vaccination certificate has yet to become valid.



ACCOMMODATION

TRANSPORTATION

Arriving and departing into Singapore



AIR TRAVEL

Changi International Airport is the main commercial international gateway into Singapore. With over 6,700 weekly flights served by more than 90 airlines to over 150 cities, Changi continues to serve as a key gateway to the Asia-Pacific region, connecting lives and bringing together people from all over the world to Singapore.



LAND TRAVEL

Singapore has two land checkpoints connecting vehicular traffic and travellers with Malaysia.

- Woodlands Checkpoint
- Tuas Checkpoint



LOCAL TRANSPORTATION

Whatever your preferred mode of commute, travelling in Singapore is convenient and efficient, thanks to an extensive and integrated network of roads, trains, buses, taxis and private hire cars. Singapore's land transport infrastructure and system is reliable, safe and meets the diverse transport needs of commuters.

Travellers with physical disabilities have good transport options, as Singapore has invested significantly in making our public buses and trains accessible for commuters with different disabilities, including ramps and step-free access for wheelchair users and wayfinding tools for the visually- or hearing-impaired.

a) Public Transport – Rail & Bus

The rail & bus system, which moves millions of passengers daily, is complemented by a public bus network that covers almost every part of Singapore. This extensive and integrated network helps commuters get around with ease and keeps Singapore moving as a convenient business and entertainment hub to live, work and visit.

Singapore Tourist Pass

Access Singapore with just one card, the [Singapore Tourist Pass](#) is a special EZ-Link card that offers tourists unlimited* public transport travel on Singapore's basic bus services, MRT and LRT trains within the validity period. (*Terms and conditions apply)

Public transport information

MyTransport.SG mobile app provides public transport information to help one get around Singapore. Download the free app while in Singapore to access info on nearby bus services, MRT stations and the latest traffic information.

b) Taxi & Private Hire Cars (Grab, Gojek, Tada, Ryde)

Taxis or private hire cars offer all-hours convenience and door-to-door comfort. In Singapore, you can flag a taxi along the street or at designated taxi stands or book a ride anytime via ride-hailing mobile apps.

c) Car Rental

If you are interested to explore Singapore at your own pace, renting a car is a viable alternative. To drive in Singapore, you will need an International Driving Permit along with your original driver's license. Several car rental companies operate in Singapore, many offering services right from Changi Airport.

MEDICAL SERVICES

During the World Aquatics Masters Championships, the Singapore 2025 Organising Committee ensures the provision of medical services to cater to the healthcare needs of participants and guests. The organising committee places significant importance on the well-being and safety of individuals during the events. The medical services provided may include:



MEDICAL CARE

Available at all competition and training venues covered by trained medical professionals, including doctors, nurses, and paramedics, to offer immediate medical assistance. They are equipped to handle minor injuries, illnesses, and medical emergencies that may arise during the Championships.



FIRST AID STATIONS

First aid stations are set up at various event locations to provide basic medical care. These stations are equipped with essential medical supplies and equipment to treat minor injuries, such as cuts, bruises, or sprains.



AMBULANCE SERVICES

Ambulances will be stationed at strategic points to ensure rapid response in case of any serious medical emergencies. They are equipped with essential medical equipment and can transport individuals to nearby hospitals.



EMERGENCY MEDICAL SUPPORT OUTSIDE THE CHAMPIONSHIPS' VENUES

For emergency (life-threatening) situations, please call 995. For non-emergency ambulance service in Singapore, dial 1777. Patients will be taken to nearby public hospitals.



All participants and guests are required to purchase travel insurance that minimally covers medical and accident-related expenses for the full length of stay in Singapore.
